Summary:

Accepting and believing who we are in Christ allows us to do miracles. As reflections of Jesus, we have the same capability to walk on water the way He and the apostle Peter did. We have the supernatural authority to heal just like Jesus heals—if we believe it. Seeing manifestations of what has already been done requires getting in sync with our identity, as defined by God's Word. Even before He established the foundations of the world, God declared us righteous, redeemed, and holy, with no self-effort on our part. We're His children, with no need for us to earn that status. Because of who we are, we have the same authority and dominion as Christ; we must never let anyone convince us otherwise.

Notes:

1. We're not "mere" humans, but reflections of God, Himself. We must remember our identity.
2. Jesus died for us so that we could die to our old sinful selves and be raised up to new life and new identities in Him. This applies not just to Christians and people who go to church, but to everyone—saved and unsaved.
3. To accept our true identity is actually to point back to our true design in Christ, before the fall of man, before the law was given, and before worldly religion was established.
4. When God created mankind, not only did He make man like Himself, but He also breathed into him His own breath of life. No matter how bad our performance is or how many mistakes we make, we mustn't forget that we're still His children, and He's still our heavenly Father.
5. We're as blameless in this life as Jesus. We must remember who we are and respond to situations accordingly.
