

Sin Will Never Be Greater Than Grace

Summary:

Even after getting born again, we'll still have moments when we commit a sinful act and fall short. However, we're not what we do, but who God says we are. Regardless of our shortcomings, accepting Jesus makes us righteous in God's eyes. When God looks at us, He therefore sees righteousness, not sins. Religion makes sin a central issue, but Jesus took care of it permanently when He went to the cross and took all of mankind's sins on Himself. Believers have lost their old, sinful natures that separate them from God, and can stand before Him with full confidence. We're now no longer sinners, but saints.

Notes:

1. Getting born again makes us righteous. When God looks at us, He sees Jesus in us. When we give our lives to Jesus, sin is no longer an issue.
2. If we feel that God only sees our sins when He looks at us, we must remember that Jesus died so that we could be made the righteousness of God.
3. Grace isn't brittle or fragile; it's stronger and more powerful than sin. People have more faith in sin to send them to hell than in grace to send them to heaven. Jesus is grace, and He'll outlast our sins.
4. Grace is the power source our faith connects to. However, sometimes God's grace and mercy show up when we don't even have faith; we're made whole by *His* faith. More than once during His ministry, Jesus healed people who had no faith.
