Summary:

True prosperity isn't defined by material wealth or external success but by a relationship with God and the wholeness that comes from it. Prosperity is a finished work through Jesus Christ, and believers are already blessed with all spiritual blessings. Let's challenge the traditional transactional view of giving: give out of love and devotion rather than obligation. True prosperity involves peace, joy, righteousness, and a deep relationship with God, rather than just material abundance.

Notes:

1. True prosperity isn't about material wealth but about having a relationship with God. Joseph's story in Genesis 39 illustrates that prosperity comes from God's presence, not material possessions.
2. Under the old covenant, blessings were tied to obedience, but the New Covenant focuses on grace and the finished work of Jesus.
3. Prosperity equals wholeness, which includes peace, joy, health, purpose, and relationships, not just finances. Real prosperity involves a life of peace, joy, and righteousness, with material needs being secondary.
4. Giving should be an act of love and trust in God's provision, not a transactional effort to gain prosperity.
5. Believers are already blessed with every spiritual blessing in Christ, and prosperity is a state of being, not a result of striving. The new covenant emphasizes receiving from God as His children, not working for blessings.
